About Safe at Home

If you are a survivor of domestic violence, stalking or sexual assault and are living at an address unknown to your perpetrator, Safe at Home can help protect your anonymity by providing confidential mail-forwarding services and many other benefits.

Since 1999 California's confidential address program has served over 4,500 women, men and children. Participants seeking to start new lives free from violence can benefit from this no-fee service.

Any California resident who has been a victim of domestic violence, stalking or sexual assault, or is a reproductive healthcare employee, patient or volunteer, may participate in the Safe at Home Program.

When you qualify for the program, a Safe at Home P.O. box in Sacramento becomes your official address of record for all state and local agencies. Your first-class mail is packaged in strict confidence and forwarded to your confidential California home address.
